

RIDGEVIEW HIGH SCHOOL FORECASTING INSTRUCTIONS

1. Student print your full name and student ID number legibly on course selection sheet.
2. Identify the courses you are forecasting for on course selection sheet.
When choosing courses, grades 10-12 should refer to their current transcript to ensure that selections are appropriate to meet graduation requirements and post-graduation plans such as college entrance requirements.
3. Review the online course guide for specific course information including:
 - Graduation requirement(s) the course fulfills
 - Grade levels allowed to take the course
 - Prerequisites for the course
 - Is the course repeatableOnline course guide may be located at: <https://rvhs.redmondschools.org/counseling/forecasting/>
4. Have parent/guardian sign form after discussing your next year selections.
5. Students who forecast and enroll in AP/CN courses are committing to each course for the full year.
6. You will be meeting with your counselor to finalize your course selections which will be emailed to families.

FORECASTING FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q: Can I schedule an individual meeting with my student's school counselor to go over their course options?

A: During the forecasting process counselors will meet with each one of their students making it very difficult to schedule individual meetings with parents/guardians during this time. If after the forecasting process you have questions and concerns, please contact your student's counselor via phone or email to set up an appointment.

Q: Can my student have an open period?

A: Only 11th and 12th grade students may have an open period. Student must be on track to graduate and have counselor and parent/guardian approval.

Q: Can my student request to have classes at specific times or with specific teachers?

A: With 1,000 plus students it is difficult to accommodate specific requests regarding class meeting times and teachers. In order to have enough seats and options each period for every student, classes must be spread throughout the day and student schedules must be balanced throughout the day. Therefore we are unable to accommodate specific requests. If your student has a concern because of a medical need, please contact your student's counselor to go over options.

Q: If my student changes their mind regarding the classes they want to take, can they change their schedule in the fall?

A: Schedule changes are only made in the event a student has been placed in the wrong level, is missing a class they need for graduation, or if they have an open they need to fill. Our schedule is built based on the data we receive from student forecasting, the amount of spots we have for each class is decided from how many students requested the class. There are typically not enough remaining spots in classes to accommodate changes. So please forecast carefully and thoughtfully!

Q: When do schedules come out?

A: They will be available for viewing in StudentVUE or ParentVUE Friday, September 3rd. Information will be posted on the Ridgeview website for information regarding StudentVUE or ParentVUE access beginning August 9th.

Q: How can my student take classes at COCC?

A: There is a program called Expanded Options that allows 11th and 12th grade students to take classes at COCC while still attending RVHS. Students need to share with their counselor if they are interested in this program during their forecasting meeting.

Q: Can my student take classes online?

A: Ridgeview High School offers an online skills recovery for students off track for graduation. Enrollment in this program is by administration or counselor recommendation only.
